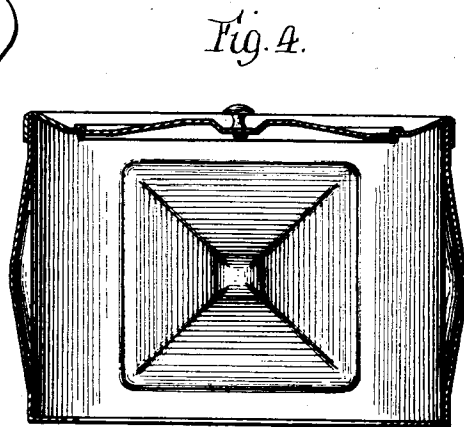
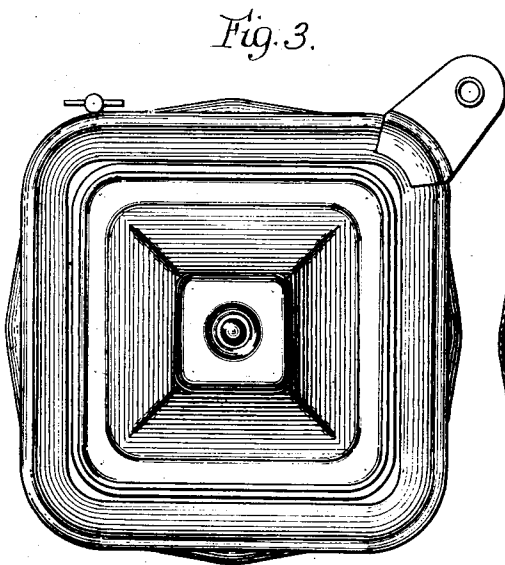
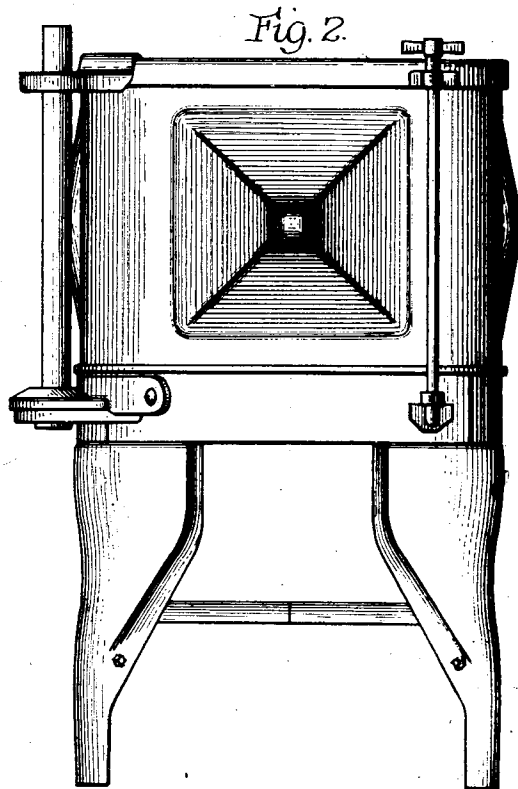
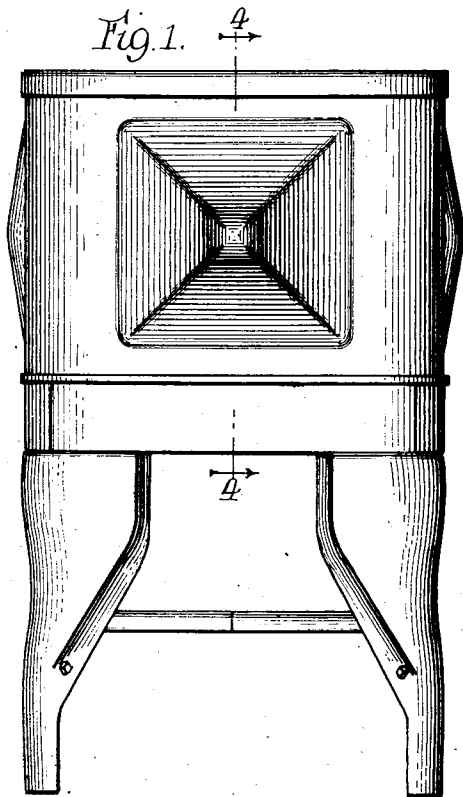

DESIGN FOR A WASHING-MACHINE CASING

Application filed January 12, 1929. Serial No. 29,583. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SIMON E. SCHROEDER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Minier, in the county of Tazewell and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Washing-Machine Casing, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part hereof.

In the drawings:

Fig. 1 is a front elevation of a washing machine casing, showing my new design.

Fig. 2 is a rear elevation of the same.

Fig. 3 is a plan view of the machine.

Fig. 4 is a central vertical section of the tub element only taken substantially on the line 4—4 of Fig. 1.
